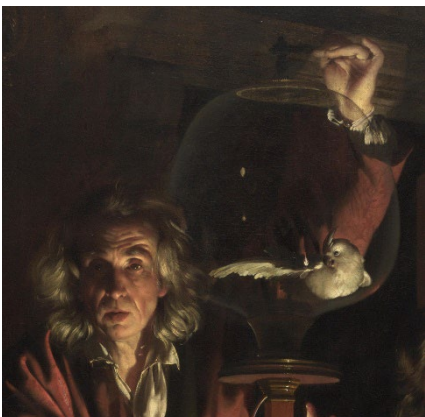

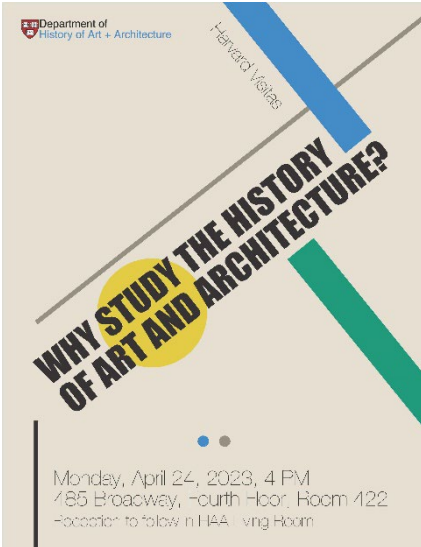

Scott previously served as the Nancy and Steve Crown Family Chief Curator in 2015, and Senior Deputy Director in 2018. Prior to his work at the Whitney, Scott served as the Senior Editor of *Artforum International* from 2004 through 2009. He began his curatorial career at the Harvard University Art Museums, organizing *Mel Bochner: Photographs, 1966–1969* (2002) and *Huyghe + Corbusier: Harvard Project* (2004, with Linda Norden).
