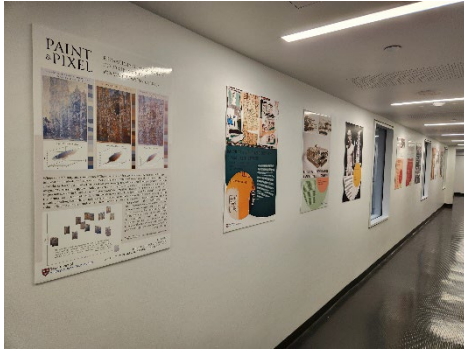
- **Ackerman Prize:** David Shaw, for his senior thesis *Reclaiming the Parking Garage: A New Preschool for Cambridge*.
